FROM RESCUE TO RESTORATION

For 50 years, CCA has led the way for people facing a crisis. CCA's holistic approach from rescue to transition helps families in need achieve self-sufficiency by offering a "hand up" instead of a hand-out. Our clients are guided through three phases of programming; rescue, relief, and restoration to live out our commitment to achieve self-sufficiency.



RESCUE

We meet the immediate, critical needs of families or individuals during crisis.

Emergency Financial Assistance

Provides for rent and utility assistance to prevent homelessness.

Food Pantry

Reduces food insecurity and improves nutrition by providing dairy, meats, bread, fruits and vegetables, hygiene items, and cleaning supplies.



RELIEF

We provide support to children and senior citizens.

Kids Eat Free

Provides healthy meals for children during the summer months.

Back-to-School

Provides backpacks filled with school supplies and clothing vouchers to children.

Christmas Cheer

Provides toys, gifts, stockings filled with treats and wrapping supplies for children.

Golden Angels

Helps seniors with transportation services, meal delivery, the food pantry and fellowship.



RESTORATION

We provide skills necessary for achieving long-term independence and economic self-sufficiency.

Spiritual Care & Counseling

Assists clients to find a balance in life and reconnect or strengthen their relationship with God.

Life Skills & Job Readiness

Assists clients in identifying personal goals, developing skills, and planning career moves.

Educational Classes

Classes such as GED, ESL, Computer, and Financial Literacy to improve financial stability and self-sufficiency through one-on-one coaching, education opportunities, and access to financial tools.

Together, through our Christ-centered, life-changing programs, we are empowering people facing a crisis to provide for their families with dignity on the road to self-sufficiency.

Arianna*, a single mother of five, was living in an abusive relationship. She got the courage to leave him, but had to sleep in her car for two days. She went to a friend's house and slept on the living room couch with her children. After two weeks, her friend thought it was best for them to leave because there were too many of them in her house. Subsequently, Arianna and her children went back to living in her car. CCA was able to find her housing, access to the food pantry, and support for her children. Since being housed, she has been able to obtain a better job in an office with better pay, and leave the warehouse job where she was working. Slowly, her and her children's lives are being restored.

Simone* came to CCA for assistance with her utility bill. As a single mother of three, COVID affected her and her children's financial needs. Simone was employed full-time when the pandemic hit, but due to school closures and changes in her children's educational routine, she was let go from her job. Her children had no choice but to complete their education virtually and because of this, she was left unemployed. Even though she received unemployment benefits, she knew they would not last and was offered a part-time job. The struggles and aftereffects with COVID continue to play a part in her daily struggles, as she has gone from 60 work hours every two weeks, to only 40. She maintains a positive attitude because she knows this too shall pass. Simone said, "I'm so grateful, thank you CCA for helping me through one of the hardest times of my life."






