What began as a humble Bible study group of seven people in Flower Mound 50 years ago, with a simple act of collecting canned food for a hungry family, has evolved into an agency serving more than 16,000 individuals in need every year.

Throughout our history, CCA has remained rooted in our Christian faith and values. We believe that every individual is created in the image of God and deserves dignity, compassion, and support. Our commitment to serving others is driven by the teachings of Jesus Christ and the call to love our neighbors as ourselves.

Nestled in the city of Lewisville, CCA extends its services to the communities across Denton, Dallas, Collin, and Tarrant counties. Our service area encompasses the boundaries of eight local school districts, namely: Argyle ISD, Carrollton-Farmers Branch ISD (Denton County portion), Coppell ISD, Frisco ISD, Lake Dallas ISD, Lewisville ISD, Little Elm ISD, and Northwest ISD.

With the support of our dedicated staff, volunteers, donors, and community partners, CCA has made a significant impact on the lives of thousands of individuals and families in need.





In the name of Jesus Christ, Christian Community Action ministers to the poor by providing comprehensive services that alleviate suffering, bring hope, and change lives.



To create an environment where all interactions are Christ-centered, Spirit-filled, and life-changing.

Together, in partnership with foundations, businesses, churches, organizations, individuals and our supporters, we offer wrap-around services free of charge to bring hope and change lives.



Our programs are designed with a comprehensive approach that addresses the immediate needs of those in crisis, while also focusing on long-term empowerment and self-sufficiency.

The core pillars of our programs are built on three fundamental phases: **rescue, relief,** and **restoration**. These phases serve as the foundation for guiding families on a transformative journey towards positive change and a brighter future.

#### The **Rescue Phase**:

Response to the urgent needs of individuals and families in crisis

- **Emergency Assistance** provides financial relief for rent and utilities on an emergency basis, safeguarding against homelessness
- Self-Selection Food Pantry ensures food security for all
- Rapid Rehousing helps families exit homelessness and return to permanent housing

## The **Relief Phase**:

Support to under-served children and seniors

- Back to School provides required academic supplies to ensure children's success in the classroom
- Kids Eat Free provides summer meals to keep children healthy and nourished
- Christmas Cheer ensures that children experience the joy of Christmas through gifts and celebration
- **Golden Angels** ensures seniors have access to nourishing meals through our Food Pantry, fellowship and fun

#### The **Restoration Phase**:

Comprehensive support and resources to help individuals achieve self-sufficiency and lasting change

- Education & Empowerment includes English as a Second Language, Job Readiness, Credit Repair, First Time Homebuying, Entrepreneurship, Computers, and Financial Literacy
- **Professional Counseling** equips individuals with the tools they need to overcome obstacles and break free from the cycle of poverty
- **Spiritual Care** nurtures spiritual and emotional well-being to help individuals develop a sense of purpose and resilience that goes beyond material success



Denton County is growing, and now surpasses 1 million residents. With that growth comes ample opportunity for ministry. The 2022 United Way Denton County Community Needs Assessment has brought to light a deeply concerning situation that demands urgent attention. The data reveals alarming statistics about the financial struggles faced by ALICE households, which stands for Asset Limited, Income Constrained, and Employed. These are families who earn more than the Federal Poverty Level but find it difficult to meet the basic cost of living. Shockingly, there are **102,000 households** in Denton County that fall below the survival threshold, which represents **1 in 3** households experiencing day-to-day financial instability.

To gain perspective on the magnitude of the challenge, let's consider the ALICE Survival Wage for a family of four. In Denton County, both adults in the household must earn a combined total of \$35.48 per hour, equivalent to an annual income of \$70,958, excluding childcare costs. However, when childcare expenses are factored in, the required minimum hourly wage jumps to \$40.00, necessitating an annual income of \$80,004. These figures shed light on the barriers faced by families who are striving to make ends meet and provide for their loved ones.



The numbers of families facing poverty continues to climb. We see it every day in the lines formed outside our offices. It is particularly disheartening to note that single female-headed households with children under 18 bear a disproportionate burden of poverty, adding complexity to the challenges faced by the community.

Another disconcerting trend is the persistent rise in the number of economically disadvantaged students in Denton County schools. During the 2020-21 school year alone, a staggering 45,173 students (34.6%) in Denton County faced economic disadvantage, highlighting the significant impact of poverty on the younger generation.

These sobering realities paint a clear picture of the urgent and critical nature of our mission to address the immediate needs of individuals, families, and children in Denton County. It is evident that comprehensive action is necessary to uplift those in vulnerable situations and break the cycle of poverty that perpetuates these challenges.

To tackle these issues, thanks to our donors and volunteers, CCA steps in and offers a holistic, faith-based approach to help families achieve financial stability and build a better future for themselves and their children.

# Our Volunteers RS

Volunteers are the heart and soul of Christian Community Action, and we acknowledge that their dedication and selflessness are gifts from God. From working in the Food Pantry, the seasonal warehouse, delivering meals, bringing joy to children at Christmas, teaching education and empowerment classes and many more, their dedication and selflessness are what keep CCA thriving and making a positive difference in the lives of many.

Last fiscal year, **14,720** dedicated volunteers generously contributed **30,059** hours of service, which, when combined, made a **\$1,136,430** economic impact on our community (includes instances of duplicated #'s and groups). This demonstrates not only the generosity of our volunteers but also the substantial value they bring to the community through their time and effort. Their commitment and dedication allows us to carry out our mission and serve the community in profound ways and we are forever grateful.

"I was on short-term disability after a horrible car accident. Soon after the assistance ended, I lost my son to suicide. Coping was a real struggle, and if it were not for my 8-year-old son, I might have joined him. My life began spiraling out of control, and that's when I heard about CCA. They stepped in to cover my rent and electricity, while also providing me with free counseling and pastoral support. I also participated in their Back-to-School program for my son. I cannot begin to tell you how much that helped. The financial assistance helped alleviate my bills that had piled up, which allowed me to focus on my well-being through counseling. I am better today, working full-time from home, and continuing counseling with CCA. I will never get over the death of my son, but thanks to CCA, I am able to cope, while I continue working on my recovery and supporting my young son."


